

SEMI 2017 Atom/PeeWee Christmas Tournament

South Surrey & Centennial Arenas



TOURNAMENT RULES:

Atom: December 26th to December 29th, 2017
PeeWee: December 27th, 2017 to December 30th, 2017

All CAHA, BCAHA and PCAHA rules will apply.

Teams may only consist of players who are included on the official team roster and must have at least 10 players and one goalie to participate.

Jersey colours: Home Team will be dressed in dark; Away Team will be dressed in light.

Each tournament game is allocated a 75-minute ice time.

All Atom and PeeWee teams will play 3 games in round robin. No advantage is given to home team. Points for games shall be 2 points for a win, 1 point for a tie, and 0 points for a loss. In addition, in each game, an additional point called the Sportsmanship Point shall be awarded to a team qualifying, should it achieve low penalty minutes as follows and provided the team incurs no Major, Misconduct, Game Misconduct, Gross Misconduct, or Match penalties in the game: Atom – 6 minutes or less, PeeWee - 8 minutes or less.

No overtime in round robin play.

After the round robin play, top 4 teams go into medal round, bottom 12 teams play a consolation game. In event of a tie in round robin standings, the following rules will be used in order to determine final positions: (1) Head to head; (2) Least goals against; (3) Best goal differential; (4) Least penalty minutes; and (5) Coin toss between teams still tied.

All round robin games to include: (a) 5 min warm up; (b) 1st and 2nd period of 15 minutes stop time; and (c) 3rd period stop time to be determined by referee and the game official. MVP Medals will be awarded to a player from each team after each round robin game. Each coach will pick the MVP from their own team. A player can win only once. Tournament MVP Award will be presented at the team's final game. Each coach will pick the tournament MVP from their own team.

Tournament Final games to include the following: (a) 5 min warm up; (b) 1st and 2nd period of 15 minutes stop time; and (c) 3rd period stop time to be determined by referee and the game official. In Semi-final, Gold and Bronze medal games, if the score is tied at end of regulation, a three-minute running time overtime period will be played 4 on 4 sudden death hockey. If the score is still tied, a three-player shootout commences. If the score is still tied at the end of this shootout, a one player shootout commences consisting of players who did not take part in the three-player shootout. Winner and Runner-Up Medals will be presented after the Championship Finals. The Tournament committee will rule upon all written protests and their decision will be final.
